Using techniques and tips specifically developed for youth players and coaches with very limited soccer experience, the material is targeted for beginning and novice players and adaptable for players across the age and ability spectrum.

- Clinic Coaches: learn how to introduce the most basic elements of soccer to give the youngest children a positive, sound soccer experience. Leave them hungry for more!
- In-house Coaches: gather a toolkit of sound soccer concepts that can make a dramatic improvement in your team's performance and your players' learning and enjoyment of their experience this fall. The program outlines content for the training sessions you'll lead throughout your season.
